**ACCOMMODATIONS**

If you are in the lodge or a cabin, these accommodations are not able to handle high electrical usage required by small appliances. Please plan your meals to avoid using these appliances. If you are in the 15 amp RV section, please do not use your air conditioner, microwave, or any other appliance that takes high electrical usage.

First Aid is available from Friday evening, July 12 to Sunday morning, July 20.

Just a reminder that First Aid is specifically for immediate needs, such as assessment of injury or illness, provision of first aid treatment for burns, cuts, scrapes or bruises and to arrange for further emergency services if necessary. The First Aid station and its volunteers are not able to provide this type of service to you.

- The river changes yearly and some areas are dangerous. Please do not access the river from the end of township road 342. It is very steep and very dangerous!
