**Pastor’s Corner:** Dear Friends, for some people the writings of EG White can be a sticky subject. How do we use her writings? George Knight wrote, “understanding an author’s goals and intentions is central to understanding his or her writings. Readers who fail to grasp an author’s purpose often seek to use his or her writings in ways for which they were never intended” (Reading Ellen White, 16). Mrs. White said herself that her writings “in no way should take the place of the Bible” (GC vii). She explained that her function was “to exalt” the Word of God and “attract minds to it, that the beautiful simplicity of truth may impress all” (5T, 665). She saw her purpose as bringing people “back to the word that they have neglected to follow” and that her writings “is not to give new light, but to impress vividly upon the heart the truths of inspiration already revealed in the Bible” (5T, 665). Since people have neglected to study the Word of God, her writings became “a lesser light to lead men and woman to the greater light [the Bible], since they had given little heed to the Bible” (CM 125). Remember, Psalm 119:105 declares “Thy Word is a lamp unto my feet and a light unto my path.”
