Brentwood School Board Meeting: The board meeting will be Monday, May 9 at 6:30 pm.

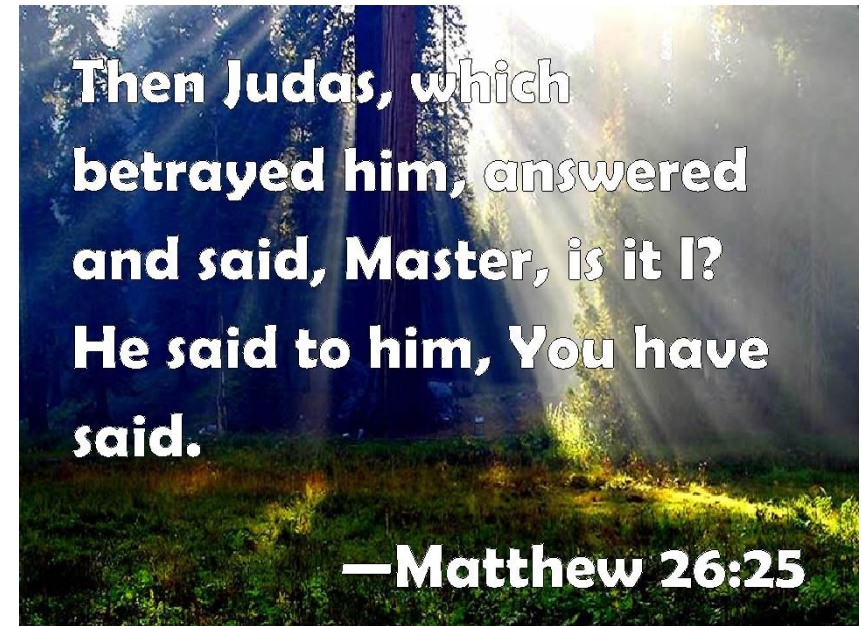

Pastor’s Corner: We’ve all been there at one time or another. You know when someone asks, “Where do you go to church?” Hopefully, the question is asked because of the life you are living demonstrates that you go, but not asked because you look like you really need to be going. The name of the church where we go isn’t nearly as important as it is for us to be the church wherever we go. The church is not the building, but the people who are being the hands and feet of Christ while awaiting His return. However, many do think of the church as a place, not a body, and most “bodies” do proclaim the name of the church where they “go” if asked. The next question asked is quite often, “What do they believe over there?” The answer varies from person to person. Some say, “Well, you know, the Bible and stuff” while others go into great detail of every single “Thou shalt not” and some do say, “I don’t really know.” Although it’s important to know what you believe; however, it’s more important to know who you believe in when asked. “Jesus Christ” is the answer. Did you know that in the Bible Jesus gave an “answer” which would make it of such that no one would ever wonder if you believed in Him? In John 13:34-35, Jesus commanded and titled a “new commandment” which is in actuality an old commandment redefined. Jesus told His disciples that they were to love God and love one another as He had loved them.
