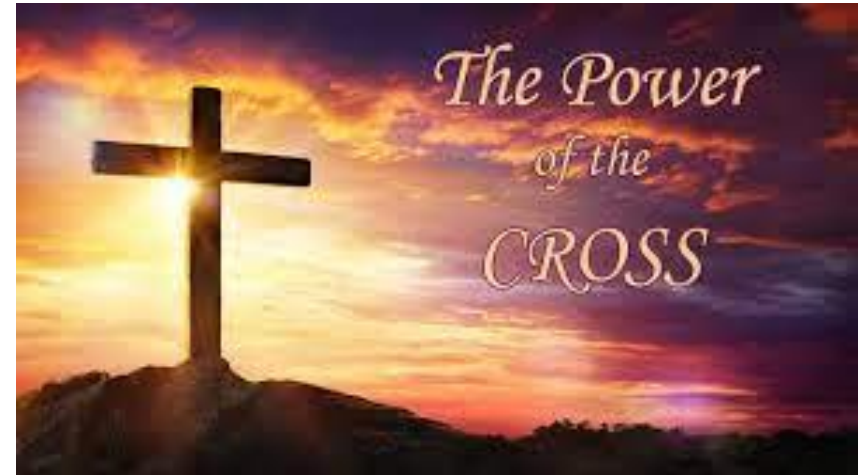

Pastor’s Corner: If you would have told me this week that Spring has arrived, I would not have believed you. There was a sudden shift in weather, and we saw a record snow fall during this week. The warnings to stay indoors as the blizzard raged and as we mostly were confined to our homes reminded me of the night leading up to the exodus. The tenth plague was about to befall Egypt. The warning – stay indoors and if your doorposts is not covered with the slain blood of the lamb, your firstborn will not survive (Exodus 12:7-13). This weekend the world is reminded of the sacrifice of the true Lamb of God whose blood was spilled for us. Sitting in our homes sheltered against the cold blizzard, we have the assurance that our lives are covered by the blood of the Lamb who died in our place. Revisiting Golgotha this week, I want to ask you – Have you accepted the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross which covers you from the blizzards of sin, and if your answer is in the affirmative, does your life reflect that decision? If not, I want to remind you what John said when he saw Jesus walking to him: *“Behold, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!”* (John 1:29).
