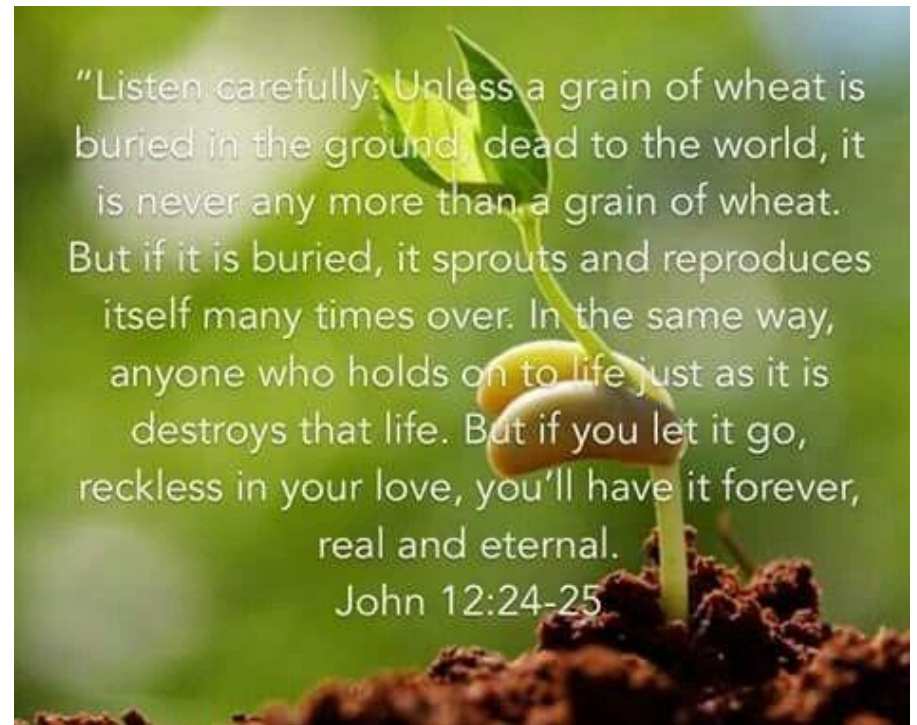

Pastor’s Corner: A farmer walked in the field one day to look at an old, abandoned tractor. The entire body was rusted. He looked at the wheels with rotten tires barely hanging on. He knew it would take a little time and energy to move the old tractor, but he wanted it moved. As he planned how to move the tractor, he knew the first step would be to turn the bolts on the wheels that had been rusting for over twenty years. He would most likely need a tool called an impact wrench made specially to move immovable, rusted bolts. An impact wrench uses both a hammering and turning motion together. When the trigger is pulled, the impact from tiny hammers inside the wrench is transformed into a rotary motion. Both actions working together saves time and energy. Christians are called to have an impact on this world. We are to give hope to those who are barely hanging on, move immovable, and trigger transformation. It is time we worked together, putting energy into action if we truly want to see God move. 1 Corinthians 12 uses the example of the body made up of different parts but working as one unit. So should we as the church of God work together for the salvation of all. 1 Corinthians 12:25, “There should be no schism in the body, but that the members should have the same care for on another.”
