Pastor’s Corner: An author unknown to me said, “In a world of knowledge and expertise, fame and fortune, status and ranks, nothing has the power to affect change as much as love and compassion.” There’s a short story in the first chapter of John where a man named Philip attempts to tell his friend Nathaniel about an amazing man named Jesus who was from a town called Nazareth—the biblical equivalent of the wrong side of the tracks. Nathaniel shows his prejudice and asks, “from Nazareth? Can any good thing come from there?” (John 1:46). Philip’s answer to this somewhat disrespectful question from Nathaniel is simple and profound. “Come and see for yourself.” Philip invites Nathaniel, and us by extension, to leave his bias behind and take a chance on getting to know Jesus who comes ‘from the other side of the tracks’. It’s an invitation to us to not judge a book by its cover, but to read the pages between those misjudged covers. The meeting between Nathaniel and Jesus was life changing for the one who judged without knowing the person. Hebrews 13:2 reminds us to not forget to entertain strangers, for by so doing some have unwittingly entertained angels. That invitation applies to us today, God invites us to set aside our prejudices. Otherwise, we may miss out meeting extra ordinary people presenting Jesus to them or maybe missing out ourselves being introduced to Jesus.
