Dr. Pierre Steenberg attained a B.A. Theology degree from Andrews University, Michigan. He also earned a B.A. Honors in Biblical Studies and a M.A. in Biblical Studies and a Ph.D. in New Testament Studies from the University of Pretoria in South Africa. Both the M.A. and the Ph.D. were attained with distinction – the highest possible grade presented at a South-African University. He graduated more recently Magna Cum Laude with a D.Min. in Pastoral Psychology and Family Therapy from the Pacific School of Religion, Berkley, California. He is a member of numerous academic societies in both Theology and counselling, including the Society of Biblical Literature and the American Association of Christian Counselors. He is the author of several articles and books, and regularly presents seminars both in the U.S.A and internationally. Pierre has been a pastor and a counselor for many years, enjoying the credential of BCCC (Board Certified Christian Counselor) from the International Board of Christian Counselors. He received additional training in the following areas: Crisis Counselling, Critical Incident Stress Management (Individual & Group, both at basic and advanced levels), Crisis and Disaster Response, Grief After Trauma, Basic Emergency Management, Clinical Pastoral Education, Numerous Courses on Neuropsychology, Psychology, to mention a few. Dr. Steenberg served the Central California Conference as the HR director and later as the Ministerial director. He currently serves as an assistant professor at Union College in Lincoln, Nebraska. Pierre is married to Karlien, and they have two adult sons. Pierre enjoys photography, research, and travel.

Pastor's thoughts on the Nominating Process

- 1) Let us pray for the Holy Spirit to impress upon the hearts of members who to choose for the Selection Committee and Nominating Committee.
- 2) The nominating committee will pray throughout for guidance and if you are approached to serve in a specific position, pray before just turning down the said position. The guidance of the holy Spirit works both ways.
- 3) The pastor will entertain no special favors and will by no means influence the outcome of either committee.
- 4) If you don't get along with someone, take your issue to that person (Matthew 5:21-24). Pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit to help you resolve your differences as no personal issues will be used to sway any committee.
- 5) Only moral objections will be entertained.
- 6) No stacking of the board will be allowed. There are enough eligible members to fill positions on the board.
- 7) Currently the church board consists of 5 husband/wife units apart from other family dynamics. This will be avoided as far as possible from here on to allow other members of the church family to be eligible for church board selection.
- 8) If the nominating committee has done everything in their power to select eligible members and they have turned down the nomination and the church board ends up with the dynamics as explained in point 6 then we will work with it.
- 9) In reference to point 6 and point 7, no 'stacking of the church board' to favor one group over the other will be allowed.
- 10) There should be no expectation to be re-elected in any given position during nominating time. Any elected position is only valid for the term the person is elected – no one holds office indefinitely. Therefore, when the term has ended, a person will vacate that position unless the nominating committee re-elects him or her again.
- 11) The selection and nominating committee will hold to the highest form of confidentiality. If it is found that this confidentiality is breached, the pastor will ask for the said committee to be dissolved with immediate effect.
