CALIFORNIA WILDFIRES RESPONSE

As horrific fires continue to burn in Southern California, Adventist Community Services (ACS) is actively responding to the crisis by offering shelter support, essential supplies (water, blankets, cots, and prepackaged food items to evacuees), gift card distribution, and through collaboration and collection efforts. More response efforts will continue in the weeks and months ahead.

How might we assist from here in Upper Columbia Conference? The best way is with cash donations. Why cash donations?

1. Flexibility — funds allow organizations on the ground to respond to evolving needs;
2. Shipping and storing physical goods is often costly and time-consuming;
3. Needs of individuals and families differ — cash allows tailor-made assistance;
4. Organizations on the ground can leverage cash donations towards purchasing large quantities of supplies at a fraction of the cost of what an individual would pay (e.g., a semi-truck full of bottled water will cost pennies per bottle compared to what an individual will pay per bottle for a case at a local big box store).
