When wars broke out in the 20th century, few American males were safe from the draft. With no choice but to go, many Seventh-day Adventist young men decided to enlist as conscientious objectors. Some worked as medics or as ambulance drivers, and a small group offered themselves as biowarfare test subjects in a program called "Operation Whitecoat". Although these men never carried a gun, they saved the lives of countless people over the decades. February 7 marks 100 years since the birth of a humble hero. Desmond Doss, the only conscientious objector to receive the Medal of Honor, risked his life to save those who had treated him brutally. Three things I want to do in heaven that I can't here are:

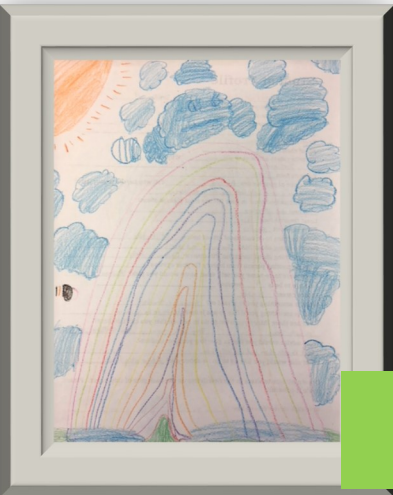
- 1) be with Jesus
