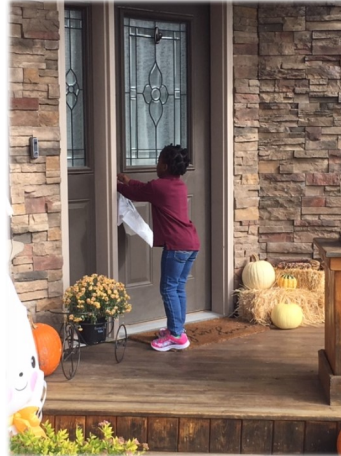

Community Service

This year the Dakota Conference has asked each school to plan two community service activities per month. We kicked off the year with a community clean-up day last month. This month, our focus is on gathering food to help re-stock the shelves at our local food pantry. This week we went out on Tuesday and passed out empty grocery bags in communities in Dickinson. We attached a note explaining our mission and asking the homeowners to participate by placing non-perishable food items in the bags and leaving the bags on their front steps for us to pick up on Thursday. At the time of the newsletter's printing, Thursday has not yet arrived, so we will give you an update on the results of our collection efforts in next week's newsletter.

Each month, beginning next week on Tuesday, October 9, the upper grade students will be going to the Amen pantry to volunteer time there. When we go, we would love to have a nice amount of needed items to take each month! Would you help us by bringing non-perishable food items and placing them in the boxes or baskets on the back wall of the gymnasium? Following are items that the pantry always needs:

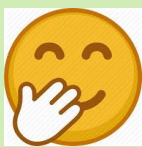
