

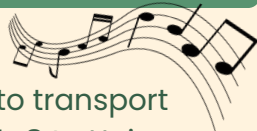

Valentine's Day Dressdown

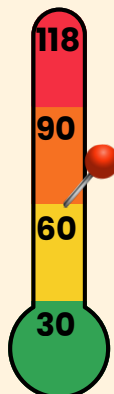

Children under the age of 12 months should not spend even a minute in front of a smartphone, computer or tv screen!

Children under the age of 5 should not spend more than 60 minutes a day in passive activities in front of a screen of any kind.
