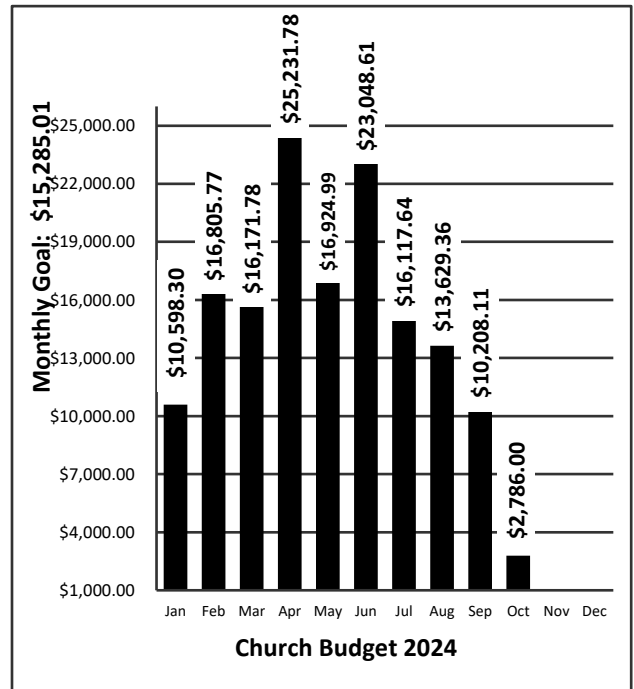
Hymnals Up for Adoption

This week's loose offering has been designated for Walla Walla University. This year, 1,356 students are enrolled at Walla Walla University and attending classes on one of the university's four campuses. When they first join our campus community, each student brings their hopes and dreams for the future and a desire to follow the right path. Their college years are a time of transition—from adolescence to adulthood, from reliance on parents to a place of more autonomy. During that process, Walla Walla University seeks to provide an environment that supports the whole development of each student. In addition to world-class higher education, those resources include career counseling and internship placement services, opportunities to study abroad, organized social activities, community service opportunities, and daily programs that nurture spiritual development—just to name a few! Last June, 346 students graduated from WWU. Today, some of those graduates may now be members of your local church congregation. Thank you for welcoming them into your community and for supporting them as they settle into new careers and lives of service. North American Division

Hurricanes Helene & Milton Update

Adventist Community Services (ACS) is on the ground and responding to the needs of those affected by Hurricanes Helene and Milton. Where are we responding? In Valdosta, Georgia, the county has requested ACS to man and set up two large distribution sites; also, the conference is anticipating a request from the state to establish a multi-agency warehouse. Carolina Conference ACS volunteers are serving with a public distribution site; Florida is working to open a Multi-Agency Warehouse in Ocala, Florida, supporting the possibility of supporting 4 to 5 distribution sites. At the time of this writing Hurricane Milton has not yet hit, but has strengthened to a category 5. The North Pacific Union will soon deploy a team including a UCC volunteer to support one of these sites for as long as necessary, which can be weeks or months. So potentially a number of teams will be deployed in the future. To donate to ACS disaster response, go to acsdonate.maxcheckout.com and select disaster response.
